Electoral College


US Constitution

- Article II Sec. 1
 - Each State given Electors (Senate + Congressional Representatives = #)
 - State Legislatures say how Electors are appointed

Electoral College

- US Constitution 12th Amendment
- Election of President
 - Electors in their states vote by ballot for President and Vice President
 - All States except Maine & Nebraska allocate all Electoral votes according to popular vote within the state
 - State Electors reflect the State's Vote

Who Won 2016 Popular Vote?







HOW ELECTORS ARE CURRENTLY CHOSEN

State Legislature decides how Electoral Votes are cast-<u>CURRENTLY</u> Generally, the parties either nominate slates of potential Electors at their state party conventions

or they chose them by a vote of the party's central committee or by ballot.

This first part of the process results in each Presidential candidate having their own unique slate of potential Electors.

Then after General Election Winning Presidential candidate's slate of Electors are appointed as the state's Electors—

except in Nebraska and Maine, which have proportional distribution state winner receives two Electors and the winner of each congressional district receives one Elector

NATIONAL POPULAR VOTE INTERSTATE COMPACT <u>Changes this</u> — State's Electoral Votes determined by National Popular Vote.

NPVIC Goal

Destroy State Influence on Presidential Elections U.S. Popular Vote would decide President

- NPVIC Plan
 - Persuade State Legislatures to pass laws
 - Electors allocated based on National Popular Vote
 - Once Laws are passed in States totaling 270
 Electors the Compact takes effect
 - States no longer cast Presidential in accordance with the State Vote Totals

National Popular Vote Interstate Compact

Can This REALLY HAPPEN?

10 States have passed the NPVIC laws

= 165 Electoral Votes

8 States have pending NPVIC legislation

= 97 Electoral Votes

IF pending legislation is passed

Total will be at 262 Electoral Votes

Only 270 are Needed to trigger NPVIC – YIKES!
